



NYERERE BACK HOME

President Nyerere returned to Dar es Salaam yesterday afternoon from Mombasa where he had talks with President Kenyatta and several Kenya's Cabinet Ministers.

At the airport, he was met by several Ministers, and Government and Tano officials.

President Nyerere left Dar es Salaam on Tuesday to join Prince Bernhard of the Netherlands at the Prince's farm near Lake Manyara. He flew to Mombasa from Arusha on Wednesday, in response to the invitation which President Kenyatta extended when the two leaders met in Nairobi recently.

Meanwhile, Kenya's official source said last night that Uganda Prime Minister, Dr. Milton Obote would arrive in Mombasa today to see President Kenyatta. But the Kenya President's Office refused to confirm the report.

The two Presidents together with Prime Minister Obote, are due to meet again in Nairobi on August 31 for talks on inter-East African cooperation and the future of the East African Common market.
