

# Mwalimu to meet Mzee in Mombasa

**P**RESIDENT NYERERE will meet President Kenyatta of Kenya in Mombasa tomorrow, it was officially announced in Dar es Salaam yesterday.

**A** Government statement said that the President would leave Dar es Salaam by air today to join Prince Bernhard of the Netherlands at the Prince's farm, near Lake Manyara.

President Nyerere will fly from Arusha to Mombasa tomorrow in response to the invitation which President Kenyatta extended when the two leaders and the Ugandan Premier, Dr. Obote met in Nairobi last week.

"This will give the two Presidents a useful opportunity for renewed informal contact," the statement said.

Mwalimu is expected to return to Dar es Salaam on Thursday.

Meanwhile, President Nyerere yesterday described as "a complete fabrication" a report published in a local newspaper saying that at the Nairobi meeting President Kenyatta had called for the abolition of the Central Legislative Assembly.

In a statement, Mwalimu said: "The Nairobi meeting took place in atmosphere of absolute cordiality and the determination of all three leaders to maintain and strengthen East Africa unity was clear throughout the discussions. No proposal to abolish the C.L.A. was made by anyone.

"This report may have been published in good faith, but in its origins it is a deliberate attempt to create mischief and to spread inter-East African suspicion.

"While President Kenyatta may decide to issue a statement of his own, or may decide to ignore a report whose malicious intention is doomed to failure, it is important that all people in Tanzania should understand the position.

"President Kenyatta, Dr. Obote, and myself, on behalf of our respective governments, are determined to deal with the difficulties of machinery which have recently complicated East African co-operation; this does not include dismantling the whole structure of our unity."
