15	<p>UGALLA GAME RESERVE <i>Boundaries:</i> "Commencing at the junction of the Ugalla and Msima Rivers the boundary shall follow a northerly direction along a demarcated line to a beacon situated on the East side of the Kaliuwa—Mpanda Railway line on the Lumbe Mbuga; thence in an easterly direction along a cleared and beacons line to a beacon beside the Nyumbu—Siri track; thence in a south-easterly direction along a cleared and beacons line to a beacon on the left side of the Tabora—Nyonga Road; thence following the left side of the Tabora—Nyonga Road in a south-westerly direction to the intersection of the said road with the Ugalla River at Isimbira; thence in a westerly direction along a cleared and beacons line to a beacon on the left bank of the Msima River; thence in a north-westerly direction following the left bank of the Msima River downstream to its junction with the Ugalla River; which is the point of commencement."</p>	<p>Tabora and Rukwa— Tabora and Mpanda Districts. 5,000 sq. k.m.</p>
16	<p>UMBA GAME REESERVE <i>Boundaries:</i> "Commencing at the junction of the Tanga/Kilimanjaro regional boundaries with the Tanzania-Kenya international boundary the reserve boundary follows the Kenya boundary south-eastwards to a point due north of Gerevi Hill; thence in a straight line south through Gerevi Hill to the Uмба river; thence following the south bank of the Uмба river upstream to a beacon on the said bank due south of Mazunya Hill and approximately two kilometres east of the confluence of the Uмба and Mbaramu rivers; thence in a straight line northwards to the summit of Mazunya hill; thence north-westwards to the summit of Kigongojiwa-Kubwa ridge; thence westerly in a straight line to Masambura waterhole; thence westerly to the eastern summit of Karambatu Hill; thence south-westerly to Mabili Usambaa Hill; thence North westerly to Kashugu waterhole; thence following the Kilimanjaro—Tanga regional boundary north east-wards to the point of commencement."</p>	<p>Tanga—Lushoto District. 1,500 sq. k.m.</p>
17	<p>UWANDA GAME RESERVE <i>Boundaries:</i> "Commencing at the high water mark of Lake Rukwa where the Momba River enters Lake Rukwa—the boundary follows the Momba River upstream on the right bank to Mamalundulu Village; thence on a cleared and beacons line on a bearing of 280 degrees to Kilangawala Village on the old road leading to Nkamba Village; thence on a bearing of 255 degrees to a point on the Msanvia River where another cleared and beacons line on a bearing of 355 degrees runs to the high water mark of Lake Rukwa near the fishing village of Nankanka; thence following the high water mark of Lake Rukwa to the point of commencement at the mouth of the Momba River."</p>	<p>Rukwa—(Lake Rukwa) Sumbawanga District. 5,000 sq. k.m.</p>

THE WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT, 1974
(No. 12 OF 1974)

REGULATIONS

Made under section 84

THE WILDLIFE CONSERVATION (REGISTRATION OF TROPHIES)
REGULATIONS, 1974

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Wildlife Conservation (Registration of Trophies) Regulations, 1974 and shall come into operation on the date of the commencement of the Wildlife Conservation Act, 1974.
2. For the purposes of these Regulations, "prescribed marking" means, in relation to a trophy produced for registration to a licensing officer having jurisdiction over any district or urban centre specified in the first column of the First Schedule to these Regulations, the marking prescribed in relation to such district or centre in the second column of the said Schedule and every such marking shall be affixed by causing the same to be indented or impressed on the trophy.
3. The licensing officer to whom any trophy is produced for registration, shall, if he is, after such enquiry as he may consider necessary, satisfied that such trophy was lawfully obtained—
 - (a) in the case of raw ivory or rhinoceros horn—
 - (i) weigh and mark the trophy with the prescribed marking and the appropriate serial number;
 - (ii) record such weight, mark, number, owner's name, date, licence details and any other relevant information in the register of trophies which shall be in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule to these Regulations;
 - (iii) issue in respect of the trophy a trophy certificate of registration in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule to these Regulations;
 - (iv) record the particulars of such trophy certificate of registration on the register of trophies as well as on the licence, permit or other authority under which the animal from which the trophy came was hunted or otherwise killed;
 - (b) in the case of raw hippopotamus teeth, animal tusks or bones—
 - (i) weigh all the pieces of each species together;
 - (ii) record such weight, number of pieces, owner's name, date, licence details and other relevant information on the official register of trophies;
